The Home Ownership Center of Greater Cincinnati, Inc. (HSP) is a private, non-profit partnership of businesses, residents, and government serving homeowners and prospective homeowners since 1973. Through several programs HSP promotes and maintains home ownership, and contributes to efforts enhancing the community.

The Home Ownership Center has grown dramatically to meet the ever changing needs of our community by providing quality education, affordable lending, supportive partnership and dedicated leadership. We have evolved through the years as housing needs shifted. Existing programs, services and partnerships have expanded and new ones were created.

HSP successfully provided Homebuyer Education to over 250 people at our in-person class in 2016 and over 178 through our web-based offering. Since 2012, we have successfully renovated 13 properties and counting. We take great pride in transforming these properties into top quality homes to strengthen our neighborhoods and communities.
